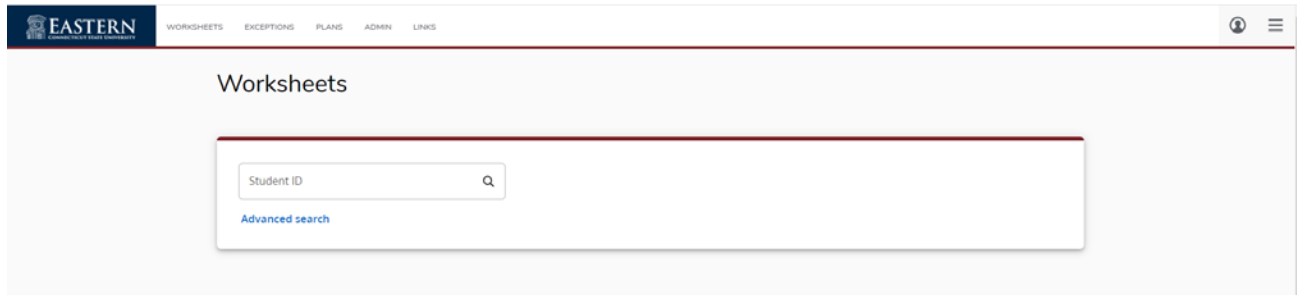

Accessing Degree Works

You can access Degree Works through via SelfService (eWeb) through the Portal at [My Apps](#)

- Select SelfService (eWeb)
 - Click on **Faculty Services**
 - Click on **Degree Evaluation**
- OR
- Click on **Faculty Services**
 - Click on **Student Search by Name**
 - Enter your Advisee's name or ID number
 - Select **Degree Eval** from the Links area.

Searching For Students

- Once in Degree Works, enter the student ID and press enter
- Or click the Advanced Search link to search for a student(s) by name, major, concentration, etc



- Select the student from the Select Student drop down menu



Reading The Evaluation

Academic/Demographic Summary: This section offers information regarding the student's advisor information, degree, major, minor, concentration, if any holds exist, transfer credits, as well as whether or not the record is confidential.
