

NOTES

LACs

Liberal Arts Core (LAC) requirements. These are broken into 3 Tiers. LAC categories may be filled by a variety of courses. Your plan does not need to specify the exact course you plan to take!

MAJOR REQUIREMENTS

> Here you will find all the courses required for your major!

TRANSFER CREDITS

> Did you transfer in AP or ECE credits? Those should be listed here! If not, we may not have record of those credits.

SEMESTER PLANNING

> This is where you will fill in your courses! Each box represents a new semester. Your first semester is already filled in!

Credits

This column shows how many credits you will earn for taking each course. Some classes have different credit totals depending on your placement.
