2008 PREVIEW

WARRIORS PASS ON THE PAST, FOCUS ON THE FUTURE

Bill Holowaty is approaching the 2008 baseball season in the same fashion in which he has approached each of the previous 39 in his head coaching career — with cautious optimism.

It is an approach that has produced four NCAA Division III national titles and 14 regional championships and which has netted Holowaty 1,217 victories — a total which has made him the winningest coach of any sport at any level in New England collegiate history.

In 39 seasons, however, Holowaty has taken nothing for granted, and left nothing to chance. In his way of thinking, 39 straight winning seasons do not necessarily guarantee a 40th; four previous national championships do not guarantee a fifth; 14 regional championships do not add up to a 15th; six Little East Conference tournament championships over the last 10 years do not automatically produce a seventh title this spring; and 23 seasons of 30 or more wins — an achievement unrivaled in the history of New England baseball — does not automatically set the stage for No. 24 this spring.

Only 18 coaches in the history of collegiate baseball at any

level have won more games than Holowaty, who points out that “you have to have luck and the right mentality to win the conference and regionals as often as we have.” After failing to win the regional tournament in its first six years in the NCAA (1976-1981), Eastern has captured a dozen titles over the last 26 seasons. The ultimate tribute to Holowaty’s ability for unrivaled consistency lies in the fact that Eastern has qualified for the championship round of the New England Regional Tournament in each of its last 21 tournament appearances. Since 1981, there has not been one two-and-through. No quick exits. No cameo appearances. Not one “thanks for comin’.”

“‘Come ready to play in May’ is our motto,” Holowaty contends. “The key thing for us this year is to have fresh players and healthy bodies going into May. Somehow, we need to do that. Hopefully, we can move players around and keep them healthy. We have some big questions to answer this year.”

Sixteen letterwinners return from last year’s 38-12 team, which won its fifth regional championship in six years after becoming the first team in the 11-year history of the Little East Conference to go undefeated in the regular season. After losing both of their games in the national tournament last year for only the second time in 14 appearances, the Warriors are ranked sixth in the ABCA/Division III pre-season national poll. To the surprise of no one in the annual pre-season coaches’ poll, they are the unanimous favorite to win

their 10th conference championship in 12 years.

Returning this year are two of last year's three All-America selections, as well as the Big Three pitching trio of senior righty **Joe Esposito**, junior lefty **Shawn Gilblair**, and junior righty **Jimmy Jagodzinski**. As a designated hitter and pitcher last year, Gilblair was 11-2 with a 2.26 ERA and batted .396 and was named first-team All-America and national Player-of-the-Year.

Six starting position players return in Gilblair, third-team All-America shortstop **Melvin Castillo**, senior second baseman **Zack Thomas**, senior outfielder **Ismael Bolorin**, senior third baseman **Trey Bongiovanni**, and junior first baseman **Tristan Hobbes**.

Behind the top three pitchers are junior lefty **Mike Tingley**; untested sophomore righty **Matt Fontaine**; junior righty **James Kukucka**; freshman righty **Jim Schult**; and first-semester sophomore **Chris Wojick**, a University of Maine transfer who has four years of eligibility remaining.

In addition to his closing role out of the bullpen, Wojick may take over as catcher for All-New England catcher Matt Cooney, who signed as a free agent with the Boston Red Sox last summer. Bolorin may move from right field to center and will be flanked by senior leftfielder **Jon Dalton**, with Schult in right. Another University of Maine transfer, freshman **Andrew Dewing**, should also see time at first base and outfield.

"We have a lot of players who can play different positions, so we are trying to develop that part of our game," says Holowaty. "The key for our team this year is our ability to develop (depth). We must develop a pitching staff, more than one infielder, more than one catcher, and a solid outfield."

Junior **Lenny Meldon** could open the season in left field, due to a pre-season injury to Dalton. Junior **Andrew Magliola** is the team's only experienced catcher and will see considerable action behind the plate. Others expected to see significant time are infielder/outfielders **John Parke**, a sophomore; freshman **Pat Smith**; sophomore transfer infielder **Travis Bass**; sophomore third baseman **Mike Palo**; junior outfielder **Andrew Smiley**; freshman outfielder **Andrew Dyer**; and sophomore outfielder/first baseman **Cesar Gutierrez**. As a freshman last year, Bass was a third-team All-New England selection at shortstop at Castleton State College.

"I haven't formulated what we are going to be like, because I haven't seen us play any games yet," Holowaty contends. "I think we can be an exciting team. We have good speed — I think we can put pressure on our opponents. I think this is a skilled team, but we need to be more mature. It depends on how the seniors lead, and if they step up. I think that we've got some competitive kids — I think that they want to win, but the question is, do they know how to win?"

"We have to keep the game simple, and play the game simple. If we do that, we can be good," submits Holowaty. "I'm optimistic."

Cautiously optimistic.

For four decades, the name *Bill Holowaty* has been synonymous with Eastern Connecticut State University championship baseball.

Holowaty is the winningest coach in the history of New England intercollegiate athletics. He has produced 35 post-season teams in 39 seasons, 14 of which have advanced to national tournament play. He is currently the only active coach in NCAA baseball — and one of only three in college history — to have led one program to as many as four national championships.

Heading into his 40th season, Holowaty has amassed 1,217 victories in 1,673 games for a winning percentage of .729 (1,217-451-5). In 39 years, he has won over 90 percent (.912) of the program's 59-year total of 1,335 victories.

Among active Division III coaches, Holowaty ranks first in total wins and is tied for eighth in winning percentage. On the *all-time* Division III coaching list, he is third in victories and tied for ninth in winning percentage. Among college coaches who have coached college baseball at any level, he ranks in a tie for 19th in total wins and is one of 48 coaches in NCAA baseball history to ever win as many as 1,000 games.



In the past eight years, Holowaty has led the Warriors to an average of 37 wins each year and a winning percentage just under .750. The team has won its regional championship in five of the last six years and in each of the last five years in which it has participated.

Having been named national Coach-of-the-Year four times and regional Coach-of-the-Year 14 times, Holowaty is known for consistency. In addition to winning four national championships, the Warriors have posted at least 30 wins 24 times in the last 35 seasons and have captured .817 percent of their Little East Conference games in 11 years of LEC play.

A tenured professor of health and physical education at Eastern, Holowaty holds a B.S. in Physical Education and an M.S. in Education from the University of Connecticut. He makes his home in nearby Columbia with his wife, Jan. The Holowaty's have three grown children: Jennifer, Jason and Jared. Jason played baseball at Brown University for four years and is currently employed by Major League Baseball. Jared was a four-year Eastern baseball letterwinner and a member of the 2002 national title team, and currently serves as assistant baseball coach at the University of Maine.

Bob Wojick returns for his 32nd season on the coaching staff — serving for the fourth season as the associate head coach. One of the nation's most successful third base coaches, Wojick has been involved in every facet of the program. On the field, he works in the areas of outfield play, hitting and baserunning.

Three years ago, Wojick was named National Assistant Coach-of-the-Year by the American Baseball Coaches' Association and *Baseball America* magazine. He became the first person other than a Division I assistant to receive the award.

After lettering for three seasons (1969-71) under Holowaty, Wojick moved into the coaching ranks in 1972. For the next 19 years, the Willimantic native teamed with Holowaty — serving the longest continuous stint as an assistant coach in one program in Eastern athletic history — before stepping down for five years to spend more time with his family.

In the fall of 1990, Wojick's sleeveless ECSU playing jersey and home white coaching jersey were officially retired during ceremonies at the old Alumni Field. He is a 1992 inductee into the Eastern Athletic Hall of Fame

Wojick retired two years ago after 35 years in the Hartford Public School system, where he is currently employed in a part-time capacity.

Wojick holds a B.A. degree in applied social relations from Eastern and an M.A. in industrial education from Central Connecticut State University.

A Willimantic native and product of local schools, Wojick makes his home in Columbia with wife, Sandy. The Wojicks have two grown children: Kimberlee and Brian. Kimberlee recently received her doctorate in veterinarian medicine from Tufts University Veterinarian School and is interning at Kansas State University. In July, she will start a three-year residency at the Chicago Zoo and Aquarium.

A 2005 graduate of Georgia Tech, Brian is currently employed by McKesson as a project manager in Atlanta.

The coaching stint is the third at Eastern for Reed, who has coached 16 seasons (1985-93, 2000, '02-'07) after lettering under Holowaty for three years.

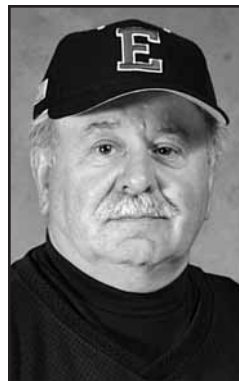
Reed was a freshman on Holowaty's second team in 1970, and was a starter on NAIA District 32 post-season tournament qualifiers in 1970, '72, and '73. The 1972 and '73 teams won the program's first two district championships, with the '73 team capturing the program's first NAIA Area 8 title and advancing to a second-place finish at the NAIA national tournament at Phoenix, AZ.

As a freshman in 1970, Reed batted .410 and earned the distinction as the program's first All-America when he was a second-team outfield selection by the NAIA. As a senior, he batted .350 and was named to the all-district team for the second time.

In his 19-year association with Eastern, Reed has contributed as a player or assistant coach to 16 post-season tournament qualifiers. Nine of those teams captured regional championships and two (1990, 2002) won national titles.

At Eastern, Reed was also a four-year basketball letterwinner under former head coach Clyde Washburne. He gained induction into the ECSU/E-Club Hall of Fame in the fall of 1989.

Reed holds a B.S. Degree in Applied Social Relations and resides with his wife, Sandra, in nearby Lebanon. The Reeds have two grown children, Melissa and Joshua.

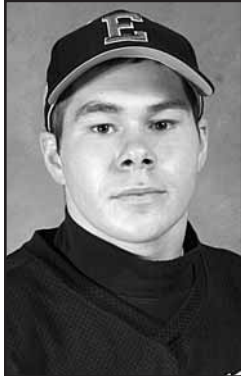

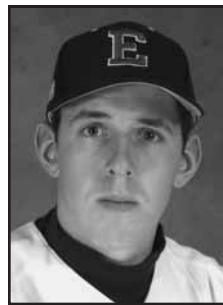

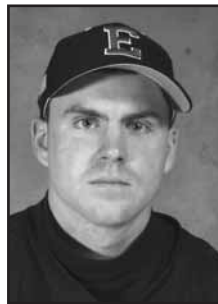
