- **Schedule** an appointment with an advisor by calling (860) 446-9457 or (860) 465-0206. Bring official transcripts of prior college credits from regionally accredited institutions with you to determine how many credits you can transfer.

Note: • RN License = 60 Credits

- LPN, Medical Laboratory Technician, Radiological Technologist or Respiratory Therapist diploma or license = 30 Credits
- ACE Military Credits are transferable

Eastern Connecticut State University Degree Requirements

The Bachelor of General Studies Degree (BGS) is a flexible adult degree program offered through the School of Continuing Education at Eastern. Available to students who are 25 years of age or older at the time of matriculation to the University, it is especially appropriate for those who have gained significant learning through their work/life experience.

Each student completes a learning contract with a Continuing Education advisor. This contract outlines the student's proposed plan of study and ensures that all degree and University requirements will be met.

Degree requirements may be met by a combination of coursework at Eastern, transfer credits from regionally accredited colleges or universities, CLEP exams or DSST tests, institutionally-approved ACE recommendations for military training and experience, as well as Eastern's Credit for Lifelong Learning Program.

General Education Requirements	Credits
Major Concentration, completed through Eastern (Maximum of 30 credits from one discipline)	36-49
Minor Concentration	30
Electives	15
Total Minimum	120

Note: A minimum of 30 credits must be earned through Eastern coursework. Within the total 120 credits required for the degree, students must complete 60 credits of coursework numbered 200-level or higher and within that 60, 30 credits must be 300-level or higher.
