Eastern Professor Showcases Work in Latino Art Exhibit

Willimantic, CT – Imna Arroyo, professor of art and chair of the visual arts department at Eastern Connecticut State University (ECSU) is displaying her artwork in the Latino Art Exhibit, “*Nosotros, Diverse, Dispersos, Intensos.*” The exhibit began Wednesday, Sept. 1 and will continue through Friday, Oct. 1 at the Charter Oak Cultural Center in Hartford.
