American Legion Boys State to Take Place at Eastern

Willimantic, Conn.—Eastern Connecticut State University (ECSU) will host nearly 300 Connecticut high school juniors as well as state legislators, lawyers, police officers, and government officials during the 64th American Legion Boys State. This will be the eighteenth annual Boys State at Eastern.

Student delegates will arrive on campus Sunday, June 26. Boys State officially begins with formal opening ceremonies at 7:30 p.m. Boys State officials have invited Governor Jodi M. Rell and hope that she will participate in the event.

The week long program is formatted to educate students on how state and municipal governments operate. Participants will set up and run mock town, city, county and state elections. Students will engage in role-playing where towns are represented, mayors will lobby, and representatives and senators will debate and enact legislation.

Joseph Tarrant Jr., chairman of the American Legion Boys State Commission, praised Eastern for hosting Boys State over the years. “Eastern makes the summer program a very positive experience for young people who cannot help but return to their communities with a desire to make a positive contribution,” said Tarrant.

Phillip Haddad, chairman of the American Legion Post 19 in Willimantic, agrees. “Boys State can be a turning point in a youngster’s life. We look forward to coming to Eastern every year.”
