Thomas Tworoger to Speak at Eastern

Willimantic, CT—Thomas Tworoger, assistant professor of management at Nova Southeastern University, will speak at Eastern Connecticut State University on Nov. 17. Tworoger's address, sponsored by Eastern's David T. Chase Free Enterprise Institute, begins at 12:30 p.m. and takes place in the Media Building, Room 145. The public is invited. Admission is free.

Tworoger teaches and directs the entrepreneurship concentration in the MBA program for the H. Wayne Huizenga School of Business and Entrepreneurship. In addition, he directs the undergraduate minor in entrepreneurship.

Tworoger is also the former owner of Kenworth Truck of South Carolina, the first U.S. dealer to sell Japanese medium-trucks. Twenty-two years later, he sold his \$130 million company to Freightliner Corporation, a division of Daimler Chrysler.
