Student Art Exhibition

Willimantic, CT— Nine student artists from Eastern Connecticut State University have been invited to exhibit their work at the Spirol Gallery at Quinebaug Valley Community College in Danielson. The exhibition runs from Sept. 11 through Oct. 20.

Some of the students who have their work exhibited have won national competitions, including Ashley Crispino '06, who was awarded first place in the American Association of Museum's Bicentennial Poster Competition. Her work also received first place in the Student Design Challenge 05-06 for the IFAI Industrial Fabric Association International 2007. For this competition Alan Buck, also an Eastern student, received second place.

The student works shown at the gallery have a wide range of styles. Christopher Batten's "Different Faces" is made out of a mix of concrete, plaster, and resin; Laurie Kammer's "Flower Child" boasts reed and paper; and Daniela de Sousa's "The Baby" comes together through a fusion of casted plaster with oil patina.

Christopher Diaz is presenting his limestone “Intercourse,” Lindsay Oliver her screen print “Mind Body Spirit,” Ashley Russ her oil on canvas “Sabina,” and Laura Janarelli her “Ambitious.”

This event is free and the public is invited. A closing reception will be held on Thursday, Oct. 12 from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m.
