Speaker to Address Global Climate Issues

Willimantic, CT – David Major, senior research scientist at the Columbia University Earth Institute, will speak at Eastern Connecticut State University on Sept. 27 as part of Eastern's University Hour series.

Major, a Harvard-trained economist, will be discussing strategies for managing the impacts of global climate change. The event will start at 3 p.m. in the Paul E. Johnson, Sr. Conference Room in the J. Eugene Smith Library. Admission is free and the public is invited.

University Hour is Eastern's Wednesday afternoon cultural and educational series. This year's series includes 15 presentations ranging from global climate change to U.S. foreign policy issues, gambling behavior, and political commentary and performances by a jazz quartet and a theatrical mask artist.
