Haycock's Buzz, a Provoking One-woman Show

Willimantic, Conn. – Brooke Haycock will bring her one-woman show “The Buzz” to Eastern Connecticut State University on Oct. 18 as part of Eastern’s University Hour series.

The 45-minute presentation will take place in Webb Hall Room 110. Admission is free and the public is invited.

Brooke Haycock is an activist, playwright, actor and artist-in-residence at The Education Trust, a Washington, D.C.-based education group. She studied theatre at the University of California, Santa Barbara.

The young woman’s works explore many of the issues faced in today’s education system and frequently spark interesting debates on the issues raised.

“The Buzz” is based on interviews with students, teachers and school leaders. The show chronicles the educational struggles and ultimate triumphs of schools, educators and students who refuse to settle for anything short of real success.

University Hour is Eastern’s Wednesday afternoon cultural and educational series. This year’s series includes 15 presentations ranging from global climate change to U.S. foreign policy issues, gambling behavior, and political commentary, and performances by a jazz quartet and a theatrical mask artist.
