**CLERY REPORTABLE LOCATIONS**

*Check the appropriate box for the following Campus Geography description. If the crime reported to you did not occur in one of these areas it is not CLERY reportable but may be TITLE IX reportable if it occurred OFF CAMPUS.*

The crime occurred ON CAMPUS if: *(contiguous to campus)*

It occurred in a building or property owned or controlled by an institution within the same reasonably contiguous geographic area and used by the institution in direct support of, or in a manner related to, the institution's educational purposes

It occurred in a residence hall or any building or property that is owned by the institution but controlled by another person and is frequently used by students and supports institutional purposes

The crime occurred in another on campus building

The crime occurred ON NON-CAMPUS property if: *(not contiguous to campus)*

It occurred in or on any building or property owned or controlled by a student organization that is officially recognized by the institution

It occurred in or on any building or property owned or controlled by an institution that is used in direct support of or in relation to the institution's educational purposes that is frequently used by students and is not within the same reasonably contiguous geographic area of the institution

The crime occurred ON PUBLIC PROPERTY if:

It occurred on thoroughfares, streets, sidewalks, and parking facilities, that is within the campus or immediately adjacent to and accessible from the campus and includes a sidewalk that borders campus, a public street that borders the adjacent sidewalk and the sidewalk on the other side of the street

The crime occurred IN A RESIDENTIAL FACILITY if:

It occurred in a dormitory or other residential facilities for students on campus *(if this box is checked please check appropriate corresponding box in the ON CAMPUS section)*

**NON-CLERY REPORTABLE LOCATIONS**

DEFINITIONS

**Murder and Non-negligent Manslaughter** is defined as the willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.

**Manslaughter by Negligence** is defined as the killing of another person through gross negligence.

**\*Rape** is defined the penetration, no matter how slight, of the vagina or anus with any body part or object, or oral penetration by a sex organ of anothe rperson, without the consent of the victim.

**\*Fondling** is defined as the touching of the private body parts of another person form teh purposes of sexual gratification, without the consent of the victim, including instances where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her temporary or permanent mental incapacity.

**\*Incest** is non-forcible sexual intercourse between persons who are related to each other within the degrees wherein marriage is prohibited by law.

**\*Statutory Rape** is non-forcible sexual intercourse with a person who is under the statutory age of consent.

**Robbery** is the taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.

**Aggravated Assault** is an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm.

**Burglary** is the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft.

**Motor Vehicle Theft** is the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle.

**Arson** is any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc.

**\*Dating Violence** is committed by a person who is or has been in a social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature with the victim; and where the existence of such a relationship shall be determined based on a consideration of the length of the relationship, the type of relationship or the frequency of interaction between the persons involved in the relationship.

**\*Domestic Violence** includes felony or misdemeanor crimes of violence committed by a current or former spouse or ntimate partner of the victim, by a person with whom the victim shares a child in common, by a person who is cohabitating with or has cohabitated with the victim as a spouse, by a person similarly situated to a spouse of the victim under the domestic or family violence laws of the jurisdiction receiving grant monies, or by any other person against an adult or youth victim who is protected from that person’s acts under the domestic or family violence laws of the jurisdiction.

**\*Stalking** is engaging in a course of conduct directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to fear for his or her safety or the safety of others or suffer substantial emotional distress.

**Hate crime** is a criminal offense committed against a person or property which is motivated, in whole or in part, by the offender’s bias. Any of the above crimes or any other crime involving injury, larceny-theft, simple assault, intimidation, and destruction/damage/vandalism of property committed based on the following category of prejudice (race, gender, religion, sexual orientation, ethnicity, or disability).

**Drug Violation** is the non-prescribed use, possession, sale, purchase or distribution of any controlled substance, to include but not limited to marijuana, cocaine, amphetamines, heroin, hallucinogens, barbiturates and paraphernalia in violation of the laws of the State of Connecticut.

**Liquor Law Violations** are violations of laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, sale, transporting, furnishing, possessing of intoxicating liquor; maintaining unlawful drinking places, bootlegging, operating a still, furnishing liquor to minor orintemperate person, using a vehicle for illegal transportation of liquor, drinking on a train or public conveyance, all attempts tocommit any of the aforementioned.

(Drunkenness and driving under the influence are not included in this definition.) **Weapons Violations** are the possession, use, sale, purchase, or transfer of any weapon, including but notlimited to firearms, electronic defense weapons, edged weapons, martial art weapons, in violation of the laws of the State ofConnecticut and/or the policies of Eastern Connecticut State University.
