## Top Tips for Using *Choice Reviews Online*



Choice Reviews Online (On campus only): <http://www.cro2.org/> or via Databases A-Z

“*Choice: Current Reviews for Academic Libraries* is the premier source for reviews of academic books, electronic media, and Internet resources of interest to those in higher education. More than 35,000 librarians, faculty, and key decision makers rely on *Choice* magazine and *Choice Reviews online* for collection development and scholarly research. *Choice* reaches almost every undergraduate college and university library in the United States. Each year *Choice* publishes more than 7,000 reviews that are:

- **Timely** - typically the first comment on scholarly publications
- **Authoritative** - written by selected experts in the subject
- **Concise** - brief but thorough, providing information and recommendations

- **Easy to Use** - logical arrangement, including data needed to order the item reviewed

→ You must disable the **pop-up blocker** on your browser and security software to **print, e-mail, and download** from the <http://www.cro2.org> site. Also check your **toolbar settings** (e.g., Google toolbar); again, you may have to turn off the pop-up blocker.

- To browse **new reviews**, click on **Current Issue** and scroll down to the **Browse Reviews** section. To browse reviews and feature articles from **3 previous issues**, use the **Recent Issues** menu.
- Keyword searching in **Quick** and **Advanced Search**: All variations of a search term will automatically be retrieved. To limit to specific words or phrases, enclose the words in quotation marks: e.g., **civil** will retrieve **civil, civilized, and civilization**; **'civil rights'** can focus the topic.
- To receive **monthly updates of new titles in your areas of interest**, click on the **Register** link to **create a profile** and obtain a **password**. If you currently have a profile, please review the many new options available in the **My Profile** section. You can change your Profile as frequently as you like and immediately view titles that match the revised Profile.
- You can also change the **publication date** at the top of **My Monthly Reviews** to view reviews matching your profile for any previous issue.
- To **store lists of titles online** or to **save searches**, you also need to **Register** to create a profile and obtain a password.
- Important expanded search options in **Advanced Search**: **Keyword in Library of Congress subject heading, LC class number, and Choice recommendation and readership levels**.
- More options for **displaying records**: You can now **sort and view** records by **Publication Year, Title, Author/Editor, Publisher, Choice Subject, LC Class #**.
- **Saved search strategies**: You can **create and save frequently useful search strategies** in **Quick Search** or **Advanced Search** to run again in the future; click on **Save Search** after running a search.
- You can identify **libraries near you that own a title** by clicking on the hyperlinked **ISBN** in a record, which will connect to **WorldCat's 'Find in a Library'** feature.
