Prominent Actor to Perform at Eastern

Willimantic, Conn. – On Feb. 12, veteran actor Mel Johnson, Jr. will present “Frederick Douglass: In the Shadow of Slavery.” The performance, which was written by writer/director Tom Dugan, will take place at 7 p. m. in Shafer Auditorium in Shafer Hall, located at the corner of Windham and Valley Streets in Willimantic.

Johnson’s performance is the fourth in this year’s popular 2007-2008 Arts and Lecture Series, which has already brought The Capitol Steps, The Eroica Trio and ocean explorer Robert Ballard to campus.

This one-man performance chronicles the life of Frederick Douglass, one of the most important African American activists in U. S. history. From his childhood when he was born into slavery to his perilous escape to freedom, Douglass’s remarkable life has been used by educators at every level to teach the concept of freedom and justice for all.

An actor and film producer, Johnson most recently starred on Broadway in Maurice Hines’ production of *Hot Feet*. Other Broadway credits include Mufasa in *The Lion King*; *Jelly’s Last Jam*; *The Boys from Syracuse*; Bob Fosse’s *Big Deal*; *The Rink*, with Liza Minnelli and Chita Rivera; *Eubie!*; *On The Twentieth Century*; Shakespeare’s *Hamlet*; and *The Taming of the Shrew*; *Do Lord Remember Me*; and *Sizwe Banzi is Dead*.

Among Johnson's notable filmwork was his role as Benny in *Total Recall*. He also appeared in *American Blue Note*, *Intimate Strangers*, and *In the Shadow of the Cobra*. Television appearances include David Lynch's *On the Air*; *Star Trek: Deep Space Nine*; *The Practice*; *Fresh Prince of Bel Air*; and the miniseries, *Liberty*.
