Text: Single Variable Calculus: Early Transcendentals, custom 7th edition, by James Stewart.

Calculator: An advanced graphics calculator TI-89 is required for this course.

Office hours: MF 9:00-10:00 am, and 1:00-2:00 pm, W 9:00-10:00 am.

Prerequisites: MAT 130 or placement at this level.

Course topics: Study of limits, continuity, differentiation and applications, anti-differentiation (time permitting).

Class format: Each class meeting will consist of a lecture and include related problem solving. We will also study the use of an advanced calculator in solving calculus problems.

Attendance: It is expected that you be there on time for each and every class. If for some reason you should miss a class, then it is your responsibility to find out from a friend what has been covered and assigned and make it up.

Homework: After each class you will get a homework assignment. It will not be collected and graded, but must be completed and should prepare you for the quizzes. I cannot stress enough the importance of doing the homework. It is a critical factor in building and reinforcing your knowledge, as well as helping you identify your week points.

Entry Exam: Within the first 2 weeks of class you have to take a computer based entry exam for assessment purposes to check your readiness for this class, and to let me know what adjustments I have to make. It will be counted as a quiz toward your grade. More information about how to take this exam will be given in class.

Quizzes: Quite often at the beginning of class time there will be a short quiz. This should keep you alert and following the material carefully, closely and timely.

Exams: There will be two longer exams throughout the semester. Their dates will be announced at least a week in advance.

Final Exam: A cumulative final exam will take place on Fri, Dec 13, 2013, 11:00-1:00 pm.

Evaluation: Quizzes will account for 15% of your grade, the two longer exams will account for 25% each, and the final exam will account for the remaining 35%.
