Note: Transfer students from one or more accredited institutions who enter with 60 or more transfer credits shall be considered to have met the rest of Eastern's Liberal Arts Program Tier I, including Natural Science with a lab providing that they transfer a minimum of 27 credits in liberal arts disciplines: humanities, social sciences and natural sciences. All students must satisfy the T1M and T1W requirement. Students transferring in 15 or more credits are waived of the T1-FYE
