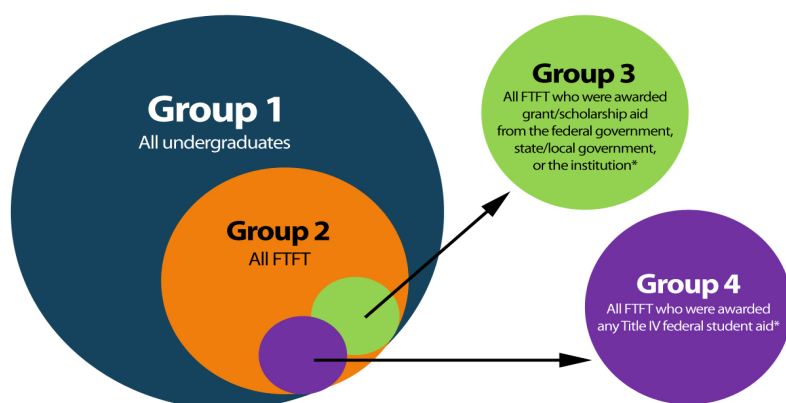
### Overview
