Different types of GI Bills (eligibility based upon service):

Post 9/11GI Bill

-If on active duty for more than 90 days after Sep 10, 2001

Montgomery GI Bill Active Duty (MGIB-AD)

- Active Duty members who pay \$100 per month for a whole year. They are entitled to education benefits.

Montgomery GI Bill (MGIB-1606)

-For reservists with a six-year obligation.

Follow these steps to apply for your benefits:

<u>STEP 1.</u> Bring the following forms to the Financial Aid Office:

- a. *Certificate of Eligibility (COE)
- b. * Data Form
- c. * Tuition Form If applicable
- d. Copy of your DD 214 member 4 (not appl. For dependents)
- e. Course Plan (for Bachelor of General Studies major only)

<u>STEP 2.</u> Getting your paperwork processed:

<u>The staff</u> in the VA Financial Aid office will process the paperwork for you. They will send the request to the VA-Educational Office in Buffalo, NY. (3-4-week process time).

Once the information is verified, you will receive a letter from the VA with approval.
