

# Mole National Park

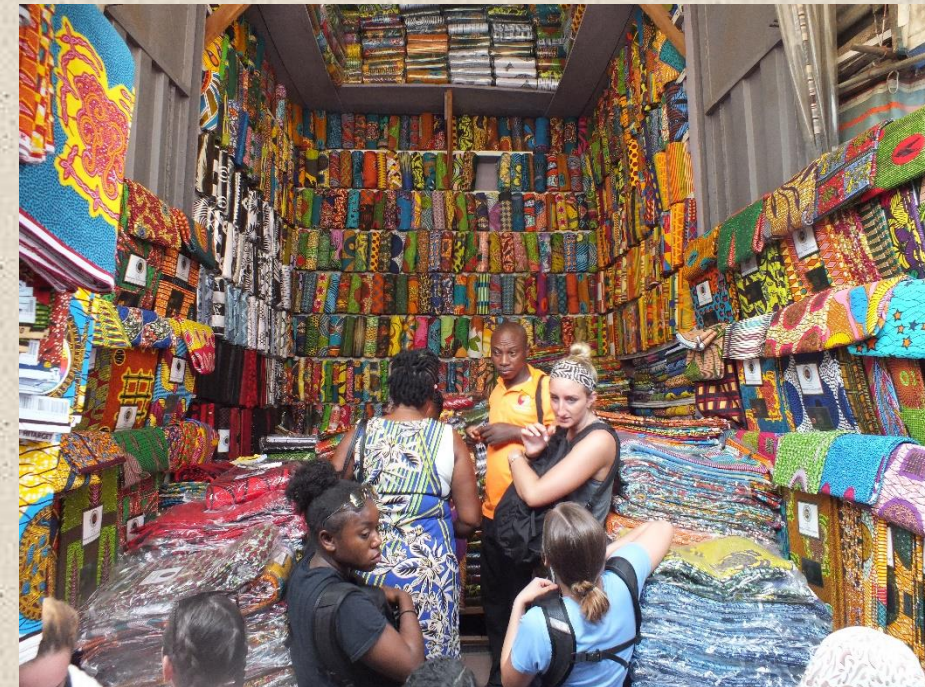
- Safari ride

# Kintampo Falls

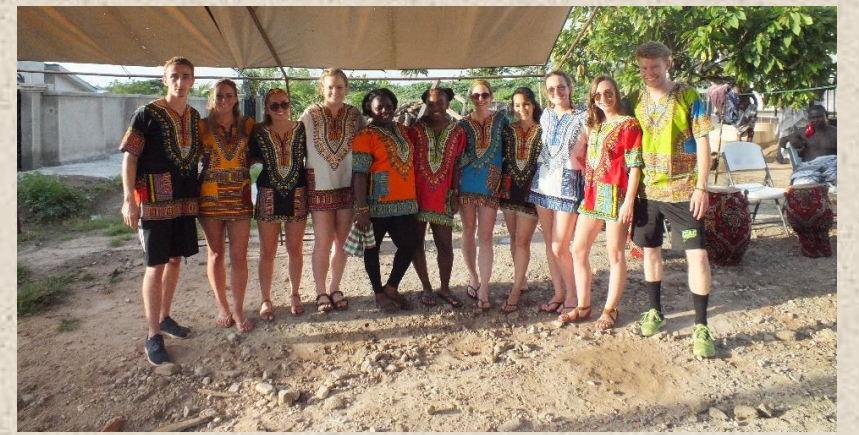


- Learned about the falls and some of the beliefs of the Ghanaian people about them
