### **Study Descriptions**

#### Identifying the Features of Drowning (recruiting lifeguards only)

2 credits / less than 30 minutes / Location: Goddard 114 (Cognition Lab - enter through Goddard lobby). In this study, you will view a series of still images taken from video of people swimming. Some of the videos show a person who is drowning, and other videos do not contain a drowning. For each image you will judge whether you think someone is drowning via pressing a button on the keyboard and then use the mouse to click on the swimmer that you are most concerned about regardless of whether you think someone is drowning or not.
