## 1

To graduate with a Bachelor's Degree from Eastern, students must complete the following requirements: General Education, Core Curriculum, Major, Residency, Major, ELAC, Foreign Language, University Writing, and Upper-level requirements. Not all requirements are included in this list. All requirements must be reviewed using the Degree Evaluation on eWeb.

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Students must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.7 or higher to be eligible for graduation.  
A minimum of 24 credits of Advanced Accounting courses must be completed to earn the diploma.

ACC 303, ACC 311, and ACC 411 meet Eastern's major writing requirements and must be taken in residence.

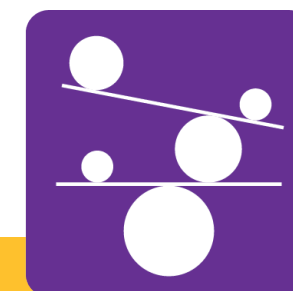

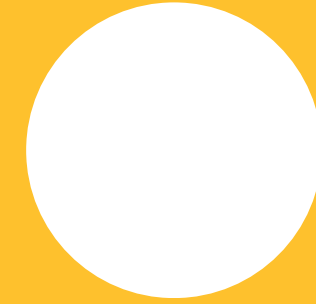
