Eastern in 4 Notes						
A degree has GPA, Residency, Major, LAC, Foreign Language, University Writing, and Upper-level requirements. Minimum of 120 credits are required to graduate. At the end if you have unfilled space, fill in with "Elective." Either Tier I or Tier II Natural Sciences must be completed with a Lab course.						
Major Specific Notes						
ACC 303, ACC 311, and ACC 411 meet Eastern's major writing requirements and must be taken in residence. A minimum of 24 credits of Advanced Accounting courses must be taken at Eastern. Students must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.7 or higher to remain in the major.
