

ADMISSION TESTS:

Standardized tests are often required as part of your admission application and evaluation. Be sure to review each program's application process and identify which admission test they may require.

GRE –Graduate Record Examination

- Standard test for most grad schools and schools of business
- Measures verbal & quantitative reasoning and analytical writing

GMAT—Graduate Management Admissions Test

- Standard for graduate management programs, e.g. MBA programs
- Measures analytical, writing, quantitative, verbal and reading skills

LSAT—Law School Admission Test

- Comprised of 5 sections of multiple choice questions
- Measures reading comprehension, analytical reasoning and logical reasoning
- Must also complete a 35 minute writing sample which is shared with each school you apply to.
- Take your LSAT by December if applying for fall admission.

MCAT-- Medical College Admissions Test

- Consists of multiple choice questions
- Assesses problem solving and critical thinking skills.
- Measures knowledge of general concepts and principles in the areas of natural, behavioral and social sciences
- Take your MCAT no later than end of your junior year between June and September
- Scoring well is often key to your acceptance
- You can take the test multiple times, HOWEVER, some schools may view this unfavorably**
- You should consider delaying taking the MCAT if you haven't completed the appropriate coursework to prepare; you haven't had sufficient time to study; your practice test scores are low
