Introduction


The *purpose* of this study is to identify how Romantic Love, Eros Love and Relationship Satisfaction correlate together.

Previous research has found that Eros Love and Romantic Love positively correlates with Relationship Satisfaction. Eros Love and Romantic Love both show the same qualities like passion, intimacy and commitment.

-The intensity of Romantic Love positively correlates with **Relationship Satisfaction.**

-The intensity of Eros Love positively correlates with Relationship Satisfaction.

-The intensity of Romantic Love positively correlates with Eros Love.



Romantic Love (M = 3.79, SD = .72)positively correlated with Relationship Satisfaction (*Md* = 4.60, $r_{s}(66) = .46, p < .001$


Eros Love (*Md* = 4.43, *Range* = 2.57) positively correlated with Relationship Satisfaction (*Md* = 4.60, Range = 2.80). $r_{s}(66) = .63, p < .001$

Romantic Love (M = 3.79, SD =.72) positively correlated with Eros Love (*Md* = 4.43, *Range* =

 $r_{s}(66) = .40, p = .001$

Methods

Participants: -68 participants



Measures: Romantic Love was measured using the Love Attitudes Scale Eros Love was measured using the Love Attitudes Scale Relationship Satisfaction was measured using the Satisfaction level questionnaire

Procedure:

-Participants emailed the researcher for the link to the study -Participants agreed to the Consent Form and filled out the study -Participants entered their email after the study to receive the debriefing form -Researcher emailed the debriefing form to the participants

Discussion

Hypothesis:

-The hypotheses were supported based on the data. -Romantic love and Relationship Satisfaction had an effect size of .46 which shows high significance between variables. -Eros love and Relationship satisfaction's effect size exceeded with .63 which proves they are very strong together. -Romantic Love and Eros Love's effect size is .40 which is showing these variables are compatible together. **Conclusion:**

-The more Romantic Love and Eros Love couples experience the more likely there will be Relationship Satisfaction. -Romantic Love and Eros love have strong relationship qualities that result in a great romantic relationship. **Implications:**


-The implications of this study can show the trends between the different love characteristics in a relationship.
