

# Relationship Between Family Relationship Quality and Community Engagement on Adolescent Substance Use

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## Introduction

- Examine the influence quality of family relationships and the level of adolescent and parental community involvement has on adolescent substance use
- The **purpose** is to identify protective and risk factors of adolescent substance use, since it is a leading public health concern.

## Hypotheses & Background

- H1:** Adolescents with higher quality family relationships will less likely engage in substance use.
  - Gallagher et al. (2007) found that stronger family bonds facilitated self-efficacy and refusal skills, which are essential in decreasing substance use in adolescents
- H2:** The more an adolescent is involved and connected to a community, the lower their substance usage will be.
  - Higher levels of community participation reduced the probability of substance use in adolescents (Lardier et al., 2018).
- H3:** The more involved and connected a family is to their community, the higher quality their family relationships will be.
  - Parents with low connectivity to their community report having lower family relationship quality (O'Neal et al., 2018)

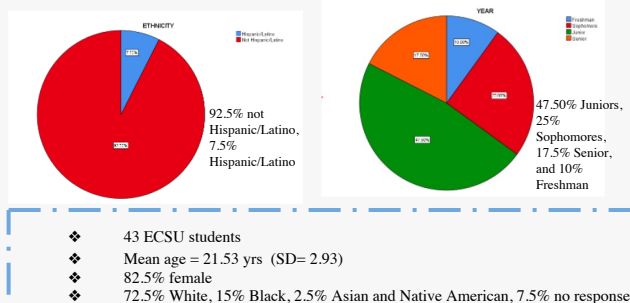
## Measures

- Brief Family Relationship Scale
- Substance Use Measure
- Brief Scale of Sense of Community for Adolescents (SOC-A)

## Procedure

- Informed consent form
- Brief Family Relationship Scale (BFRS)
- Substance Use Measure
- Brief Scale of Sense of Community for Adolescents (SOC-A)
- Brief Scale of Sense of Community for Adolescents (SOC-A) for parents
- Demographics questionnaire
- Receive debriefing form, referral list, and research credit

## Discussion

- H1: Spearman's rho - Supported**
  - Higher quality family relationships are a robust protective factor for adolescent substance use (McArdle et al., 2002).
- H2: Pearson's r correlation - Not Supported**
  - Peers are part of one's community and peer-influence can influence adolescent substance use (Crawford & Novak, 2008).
- H3: Spearman's rho - Supported**
  - Community engagement acts as a buffer to negative parental stress-related behaviors which increases family relationship quality (Zaidman-Zait et al., 2016).

## Limitations

- Social desirability bias
- Lack of external validity
- Substance Use Measure had poor internal consistency

## Implications & Future Research

- Increase diversity of participants
- Use a different measure for the variable substance use
- Promote activities that will increase family relationships
- Encourage parents to get involved in their community

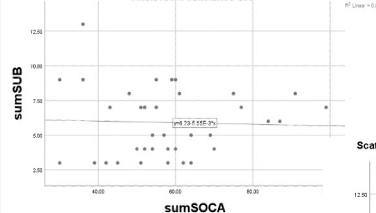
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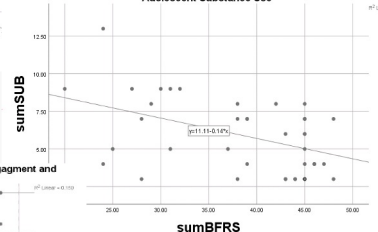
## Results

Scatterplot of the Relationship Between Adolescent Community Engagement and Adolescent Substance Use



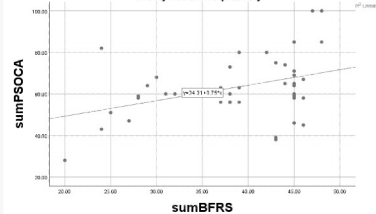
Adolescent community engagement was not significantly related to adolescent substance use,  $r(39) = -0.40, p = 0.80$ .

Scatterplot of the Relationship Between Family Relationship Quality and Adolescent Substance Use



As family relationship quality increased, adolescent substance use decreased,  $q(39) = -0.40, p = 0.01$ .

Scatterplot of the Relationship Between Parental Community Engagement and Family Relationship Quality



As parental community engagement increased, family relationship quality increased,  $q(39) = 0.36, p = 0.02$ .
