Course title: Intermediate French II
Pre-requisites: FRE 210
Number of credits: 3
Catalog course description: Continuation of FRE 210: Intermediate French I.
Required instructor qualifications: Master's degree in French or an allied field; college teaching experience preferred
Course's audience and role in Eastern's curriculum: This course counts toward the minors in French and World Languages.
Learning outcomes: By the end of this course, students will be able to: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Understand targeted French spoken at a near normal pace• Develop rapport with an individual• Ask and answer questions on a variety of specialized topics and narrate present events and past events• Read intermediate-level material in French and gain experience in reading materials written for the native speaker• Write intermediate French of the same level as their speaking skills• Understand variations in Francophone cultures
Primary modes of instruction: Students engage in conversations in pairs and small groups as well as giving short presentations. They may complete role-play activities and play educational games. The class also includes reading and listening exercises with longer, accessible texts or dialogue featuring description and narration as well as in-class writing. As the course description suggests, this course should include multimedia components
Primary modes of assessment: On campus, grades are calculated as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Exams (4 total): 25%• Compositions: 25%• Attendance and participation: 25%• Homework: 25%•
Other notes for instructors: On campus, instructors use the following textbook but this is not required of courses offered on site at high schools <i>Interaction: Langue et culture</i> .
