

Course Overview: SPA 211

Course title: Intermediate Spanish II
Pre-requisites: SPA 210 or Consent of Instructor
Number of credits: 3
Catalog course description: Continuation of SPA 210: Intermediate Spanish I
Required instructor qualifications: Master's degree in Spanish or an allied field such as Linguistics or Education; college teaching experience preferred
Course's audience and role in Eastern's curriculum: This course counts toward both the major and the minor in Spanish as well as the minor in World Languages.
Learning objectives: As this course is a continuation of SPA 210, you may use the same learning objectives.
Primary modes of instruction: Students engage in conversations in pairs and small groups as well as giving short presentations. They may complete role-play activities and play educational games. The class also includes reading and listening exercises with longer, accessible texts or dialogue featuring description and narration as well as in-class writing. As the course description suggests, this course should include multimedia components.
Primary modes of assessment: On campus, grades are calculated as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Attendance and participation (20%)• Homework (20%)• Compositions (10%)• Quizzes and Exams, including a cumulative final (50% total)
Other notes for instructors: On campus, instructors use the textbook <i>Panorama, Introducción a la lengua española.</i>
