ABOUT THE COURSE

ANT 380: Puerto Rico: History, Culture, and Environment is an elective course in Anthropology, open to all Eastern students. Knowledge of the Spanish language is not required, but recommended. Over spring break, students will learn about Puerto Rican history, culture, and the environment from both local experts and Dr. Pérez, a native of Puerto Rico. Students will visit several areas of Puerto Rico, including Old San Juan – founded in the 16th century, the Caribbean National Rainforest (El Yunque), and Casa Pueblo, a community of environmental activists. Outside of spring break, students will meet three times prior to the trip and twice afterward for debriefing and presentations.
