Political Internship Opportunities

This list comprises the sites that the department knows will take applications for internships. *Note, many internships have application deadlines. So knowing in advance which semester you intend to apply for and what the deadlines are is important.* Some of these sites have formal applications that require cover letters, recommendations, and resumes. Others have a less formal application process that requires personal contact both on your part and/or the department. Connecticut General Assembly

Students working in the Connecticut general assembly are assigned as individual staff members to a state legislator or legislators. Responsibilities typically include constituent service, issue research, bill tracking, committee hearings and public hearings. There is a formal application that is due on November 1, so please start the process of the website: https://www.cga.ct.gov/ISC/future.asp and let Dr. Krassas know of your intention to apply. General Assembly Internships are only available in the spring semester.

Connecticut Governor's Office

Through this internship, you can get an in-depth understanding of the legislative process from the Executive Branch and participate in the daily operations within the Governor's administration. This commission is the result of the merging of three independent commissions (African American Affairs, Asian Pacific American Affairs and Latino and Puerto Rican Affairs). Interns in this office would be working on policy development and research on model policy related to African Americans, Asian and Pacific Americans and Puerto Ricans in the state. Connecticut Commission on Human Rights and Opportunities
