#### **Study Descriptions**

#### **Identifying the Features of Drowning (recruiting lifeguards only)**

2 credits / less than 30 minutes / Location: Goddard 114 (Cognition Lab - enter through Goddard lobby). In this study, you will view a series of still images taken from video of people swimming. Some of the videos show a person who is drowning, and other videos do not contain a drowning. For each image you will judge whether you think someone is drowning via pressing a button on the keyboard and then use the mouse to click on the swimmer that you are most concerned about regardless of whether you think someone is drowning or not. Similarities and Differences in Perceptions of Photographs and Traits among Women and their Parents (recruiting women who identify as female and one of the woman's parents - mothers preferred if possible)

1 credit / less than 30 minutes / Location: Online. Women and their parents will either be shown a photograph of a man or a list of traits possessed by a hypothetical man. Participants will be asked to provide three personality traits which they expect the men in the photographs to possess or three personality traits which they would expect a man to also possess if he already possesses certain traits. Individuals will also be asked to rate the positivity and negativity of the traits they provide as their answers. Women who complete this online questionnaire and who recruit one parent to complete the questionnaire will be awarded one research credit for their participation. Women whose parents discontinue their participation or decline to participate can still receive one research credit for their own participation.
